

TABLEGAMES OFFERED AT HO-CHUNK GAMING NEKOOSA:

BLACKJACK: The object of Blackjack is to get a total value of cards as close to 21 as possible without going over and beat the dealer's total. All cards two through ten are worth their face value. All face cards are each worth a value of 10. Aces can be either worth 1 or 11. Blackjacks, an initial two card combination of an Ace and a card valued at 10, are paid at odds of 3/2 when not tied by a dealer's Blackjack. Once all players have made decisions whether to stand, hit, double down or split; the dealer reconciles their hand. The dealer must stay on a hard 17 and hit on a soft 17. After the dealer's hand is set, players win or lose based on whether they have a higher, equal or lower point total compared to the dealer. If a dealer exceeds a total of 21, they are considered to break and everyone still left in the hand automatically wins!

BET THE SET "21": Focus is on a player's first two cards. To begin each round, players make their standard blackjack wagers and the Bet the Set wager. Once each player has received his first two cards, the table settles all Bet the Set wagers. If a player has a pair, they win according to the posted pay table. Note: All bonus payouts apply to the player's first two cards only.

KING'S BOUNTY: Players make a standard blackjack wager and the King's Bounty side bet. The dealer will deal blackjack according to house procedures. Players will win the King's Bounty side bet if their first two cards add up to 20. The top award occurs when a player has two Kings of Spades and the dealer has blackjack.

ROYAL MATCH 21: To begin each round, players make the standard blackjack wager and the Royal Match wager. Players will then receive their first two cards, and if the cards are the same suit or a Royal Match (a King and Queen in suit), they win.

ITABLE MISSISSIPPI STUD: The iTable Mississippi Stud is a five-card poker game. Players are competing against a pay table, not against the dealer or other players. A winning hand of jacks or better pays odds on all bets.

ITABLE ROULETTE: Pick the winning number that the ball will come to rest on the Roulette wheel. There are numbers one through thirty-six along with a zero and a double zero. Numbers can be wagered straight up or in combinations that vary from two numbers, three numbers, four numbers, five numbers and six numbers. You can also bet on groups such as dozens, columns, red, black, odd, even, top half or bottom half. With easy to use touch-screens and a big, bold table display, i-Table makes playing Roulette more fun than ever before!

ITABLE THREE CARD POKER: Two ways for players to win. A player has two wagers to choose from, the "Ante/Play" wager or the "Pair Plus" wager. A player can elect to play either one or both wagers at the same time. Each wager has a separate pay table. The objective of "Ante/Play" wager is to have a Three Card Poker hand that beats the dealer's Three Card Poker hand. A wager must be placed on "Ante" prior to receiving your three cards. After receiving your three cards you have the option to fold your hand and forfeit your "Ante" or match the amount of your "Ante" wager in the "Play". There is also an added "Ante" bonus that a player gets paid for getting certain higher ranked hands. In the "Pair Plus" wager, the player is simply wagering that they will receive a poker hand of a pair or better. Depending on the hand received the player is paid according to the posted pay table. The Three Card Poker iTable also offers two bonus side wagers; Bad Beat Bonus and 6 Card Bonus!

ITABLE ULTIMATE TEXAS HOLD'EM: Instead of playing against the entire table as in traditional Texas Hold'Em; each player is exclusively playing against the dealer. To begin each round, players make equal bets in the Ante and Blind circles and may also make the Trips bonus bet. Once players receive their two hole cards, they can either check or bet three to four times their Ante. The dealer then reveals the three card flop. If players haven't already made a Play bet, they can check or bet two times their Ante. The dealer then reveals the turn and the river, and if players have not already bet, they can fold or bet one times their Ante. Next, the dealer reveals his two hole cards and announces his hand. If the player's hand beats the dealer, his Play and Ante bets win even money. If the dealer's hand beats the player, the player's wagers lose. If the player's hand ties the dealer's hand, their bets push. The Blind bet pays if the player's winning hand is at least a Straight, but if the player beats the dealer with less than a Straight, it pushes. The dealer needs at least a pair to qualify. If the dealer doesn't qualify, he returns each player's Ante and all other bets receive action. The Ultimate Texas Hold'Em iTable also offers a Bad Beat Bonus side wager!



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
